(NOTE: Classes will be limited to no more than 15 students and to those who have a desire to learn and a willingness to engage in a classroom setting)

THE ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

ENGLISH 1 (8:30–10:00)

Generally for 12-13 year olds who need to learn the parts of speech and foundational writing skills. This is not a high school level course.

English 1 is a foundational class designed to provide incoming LIFT students with the necessary skills to succeed in future English classes. During first semester, this course will cover parts of speech, sentence patterns, and parts of a sentence. Diagramming short sentences is a primary focus of this class. During second semester, this course will cover mechanics: punctuation, capitalization, and usage rules. Writing lessons will focus on learning and writing a variety of sentence constructions, which is a skill that will become important in future English classes when paragraph writing is taught. Several short stories will be used to teach comprehension and summarization skills. A Shakespeare play will be read in second semester. Ordering information will be given once the play has been chosen.

ENGLISH 2 (8:30-10:00 OR 10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 7-9 with a focus on basic grammar, reading, and writing skills.

English 2 is a skills-based English class covering the basics of grammar such as punctuation, capitalization, and parts of speech (including noun functions). Students will be introduced to a variety of literary works such as novels, short stories, and poems and will further develop their critical thinking and literary analysis skills. They will also learn to write good paragraphs, book reports, journal entries, and other short assignments. English 2 will prepare students for higher-level English courses.

PREREQUISITE: Successful completion of English I or complete a non-graded English 2 assessment.

ENGLISH 3 (12:15-1:45 - CLOSED; 2:00-3:30 -OPEN)

Generally Grades 8-10 with a focus on intermediate grammar, reading, and writing skills.

English 3 is a skills-based English class reviewing English 2 concepts and covering more complex grammar and writing skills. As students study literary works such as novels, short stories, and poems, they will improve their paragraph writing skills and learn to write good book reports, journal entries, and creative assignments. English 3 will prepare students for LIFT's composition courses.

PREREQUISITE: Successful completion of English 2 or complete a non-graded English 3 assessment.

COMPOSITION 1 (8:30-10:00 OR 10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 9-11

Composition 1 is a skills-based class offering students experience in a variety of essay writing styles as well as literature analysis. The students will begin the year with review of grammar and punctuation. Essay writing will follow with a focus on the organizational process of writing, developing an idea, outlining, and organizing the essay. Thesis statements and paragraph organization will be developed to enable proficiency in writing quality essays. Most of the year will be spent focusing on understanding and practicing various types of essays. Proofreading skills will be taught as students correct their own essays. Through use of a literary journal and class presentations, students will learn the ability to read and analyze the content of various types of literature and poetry.

PREREQUISITE: Successful completion of English 3 or taking the placement test.

COMPOSITION 2/BRITISH LITERATURE (12:15-1:45) CLOSED

Generally Grades 10-12

Composition 2/British Literature is a skills-based class offering students experience in higher-level writing exercises. Each essay will be an evaluation of a British literary work. These assignments will enable students to have more writing practice in preparation for the Research Writing class or allow students not planning to attend college to earn another

English credit. Students will also have a limited introduction to MLA style documentation by citing the book as a source in these essays. An oral presentation will be assigned in the second semester. Literary journals and class presentations also will be required for each book. **This is not an entry-level course. The reading volume required in Comp 2 is very demanding.**

Generally Grades 11-12

Research Writing is a skills-based class offering students experience in higher-level research writing exercises. Assigned essays will cover a variety of areas including historical, scientific, and current topics to allow the use of primary and secondary sources. Writing workshops in class will enable the student to succeed in the research process. The assignments will be tailored toward the style of writing expected in most colleges. Students should exhibit more proficiency in their writing than at the Composition 1 or Composition 2 level. An oral presentation will be assigned in the second semester. **This is not an entry-level course. The workload and frequency of essays are very demanding. This is a college prep class.**

NOTE: Acceptance into this class is based on the student's Comp 2 performance and approval by the instructor.

ALGEBRA 1 (2:00-3:30)

Generally Grades 8-9

This is a comprehensive Algebra 1 course that meets twice a week and gives students a foundation in solving equations, linear functions, graphing and working with polynomials.

PREREQUISITE: A clear understanding of fractions is necessary to be successful in this course and complete a non-graded math skills assessment.

ALGEBRA 2 (10:15-11:45)

Generally Grades 9-12

This is a comprehensive Algebra 2 course, which meets twice weekly. This course will cover a variety of functions—including absolute value, quadratic, square root, exponential, logarithmic, and rational functions—as well as their real-world applications. The course will also cover arithmetic series and sequences, matrixes, polynomials, complex numbers, probability, and statistics in order to lay the foundation for calculus concepts.

PREREQUISITE: Students should be able to graph linear functions and perform operations with fractions and integers.

Geometry may be taken before or after Algebra 2.

Generally Grades 7-8

This is a comprehensive pre-algebra course designed to establish relative skills for success in required college bound studies such as algebra and geometry. A clear understanding of addition, subtraction, multiplication (including a strong working knowledge of the multiplication facts), and division skills are necessary for success in this course. Basic concepts of fractions, decimals, percents, basic geometry, and measurement units would also be highly beneficial.

PRE-CALCULUS (8:30-10:00)

Generally Grades 10-12

This is a comprehensive pre-calculus course, which meets twice weekly. This course will lay the foundation for calculus by introducing vectors, limits, and trigonometry. The course will expand on all functions taught in Algebra 2 by manipulating, analyzing, and building functions in relation to real-world applications. This course will also expand on statistics and probability, matrix operations, and complex numbers.

PREREQUISITE: Students should be able to graph a variety of functions and solve polynomial equations and systems of equations, as well as have a mastery of basic number operations.

HONORS ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY (8:30-10:00)

Generally Grades 11-12

This biology course covers both the anatomy and the physiology of the human body's 11 organ systems in detail. More specifically, your student will learn about histology, the integumentary and skeletal systems, muscle histology and physiology, the skeletal muscle system, the nervous system, the endocrine system, the circulatory system, the lymphatic system, the digestive system, the respiratory system, the urinary system, and the reproductive system. Students will have an opportunity to view a cadaver and a field trip to *The Bodies Exhibit* is optional at the end of the year. This advanced biology course combined with *Exploring Creation with Biology* gives the student the equivalent of a

university biology course. These two courses together cover the entire advanced placement (AP) curriculum. To receive credit as an AP course, students must take the AP test or CLEP test at the end of the year.

HONORS ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY LAB (8:30-10:00)

Lab will meet on **Tuesdays** at Troy University downtown unless otherwise stated on the syllabus. **NOTE:** We will not meet each week; only when necessitated by the module we are studying and the date will be reflected on semester syllabus.

This lab will reinforce and expand on concepts covered in class. It will include microscope work and dissections of the bones, sheep brain, cow eye, cow heart, sheep pluck (lungs) and fetal pig. There is also an optional lab to view a human cadaver.

TO RECEIVE LAB CREDIT, students will be required to participate in ALL dissections.

The fee for the lab is \$10.50 per class (x 11 labs) as well as the cost of the lab specimens, which may be split with a lab partner. All specimens are ordered by the instructor to reduce shipping costs and they will not be purchased until November. The instructor has all the kits/tools for dissections so there is no need to purchase them in addition to the specimen fees, unless you want to purchase your own set.

BIOLOGY (10:15-11:45) CLOSED

Generally Grades 8-12

This high school biology course is designed to be your high school student's first introductory science course giving a general overview of ALL sciences: classification, cellular biology (cytology), Mendelian genetics, botany, zoology, microbiology, ecosystems, Creationism vs. Evolution and human anatomy and physiology. Students will gain a greater appreciation for God's physical creation, both seen and unseen, and gain a foundation for future studies in chemistry and other scientific fields.

In this course, students will be provided with 1) an emphasis on **vocabulary** of biology so students are properly prepared to have scientific discussions, 2) a strong background in the **scientific method** so they are trained for laboratory sciences in other high school or college science courses and 3) **Labs** that cover experimentation, microscopy, and dissection. A field trip to the Georgia Aquarium and the Bodies Exhibit in Atlanta will be offered (Both are optional but recommended.)

BIOLOGY LAB (10:15-11:45) CLOSED

Generally Grades 8-12

Lab will be on Tuesdays at 10:15am-11:45am @ Troy University downtown unless otherwise stated on the syllabus. **There may be a Friday lab. NOTE:** We will not meet each week; only when necessitated by the module we are studying & the date will be reflected on semester syllabus.

This class includes a hands-on lab that will reinforce and expand on concepts covered in class. Proper lab skills, lab safety, proper handling and usage of scientific equipment, and scientific method. Biology students will have the opportunity to use microscopes, study living organisms and complete several dissections including the earthworm, the crayfish, the perch and a frog. **TO RECEIVE LAB CREDIT, students will be required to participate in ALL dissections.**

***Lab may not be taken without student taking the General Biology class.**

HONORS BIOLOGY (12:15-1:45)

Generally Grades 8-12

This high school biology course is designed to be your high school student's first science course. As a college-prep course, it will set the stage for success in high school, prepare them for college level courses, and give them an understanding of basic biological principles that surrounds them each day of their lives so they can appreciate real world relevance of scientific inquiry. A student's education should prepare them for life, not just an academic year.

Students will be provided with 1) a heavy emphasis on **vocabulary** of biology so students are properly prepared to have scientific discussions, 2) a strong background in the **scientific method** so they are trained for laboratory sciences in other high school science courses, as well as university studies, 3) **Labs** that cover experimentation, field studies, microscopy, and dissection and 4) **Introduction to:** classification, biochemistry, cellular biology, Mendelian genetics, ecosystems, and Creationism vs. Evolution. A field trip to the Georgia Aquarium (optional) and Oak Park will occur in the second semester.

CHEMISTRY (8:30-10:00 OR 12:15-1:45)

Generally Grades 10-12

This general chemistry course covers concepts about the nature, composition, and changes of matter and the application of chemistry in everyday life. Our biblical goal is to study God's creation at the atomic and molecular level in order to reinforce a student's faith and enable them to realize the orderliness of all that surrounds us. Students will develop a solid understanding of the periodic table, matter and its changes, the atom, compounds, acids and bases, solutions, gases, reactions, and chemical equations. There will be a systematic study of the predictive physical interactions of matter and their usefulness in industry, engineering, other sciences, and in society as a whole. In addition, this high school science will give students a brief introduction to oxidation-reduction reactions, kinetics, thermodynamics, organic chemistry, and other specialized topics. The course also includes an engaging lab component and is designed for students who do NOT intend to pursue a rigorous college curriculum or major in a science, engineering, or medical field in college. General chemistry is a mathematical science and does require a solid foundation in physical science and algebra.

HONORS CHEMISTRY (2:00-3:30)

Honors chemistry is an advanced comprehensive high school chemistry course. The honors chemistry class will move more quickly through the foundations of chemistry in order to allow more time for advanced topics and labs. The course will cover all of the topics listed in the general chemistry description with additional emphasis on stoichiometry, kinetics, thermodynamics, and organic chemistry.
